

SAFETY PIN CUFF

Supplies:

- Safety pins (60)
- Seed beads (600 total, 200+ of three different colors)
- Elastic cords
- Scissors (not supplied)



Instructions:

1. First, bead your safety pins. 40 pins will need to be beaded (and 40 pins should remain empty).

2. Lay the pins out in whatever design you think looks best.

3. Tie the two pieces of elastic cord together and tape the end to a table or work surface.

4. You will now slide your pins onto the elastic. You will alternate between a beaded pin and an empty pin.

5. Take an empty pin and put one piece of elastic through the top hole and the other piece through the bottom hole. NOTE: The top hole can be quite small. If you can thread the cord into the hole, thread the cord into the big open space in the pin, and slide it upward into the hole.

6. Now take a beaded pin, and face it in the opposite direction of the first pin. Otherwise follow the same procedure (one elastic through the top hole, the other through the bottom hole).

7. Keep working away, alternating between empty and beaded pins. Once you have 80 pins on your elastic, tie the elastic to the starting elastic to complete your cuff.
